Resident and Non-Resident Enrollment Categories

- Within the resident category, total enrollment of AB540 students decreased $12 \%$ from 1,877 to 1,654 while FTES decreased $10 \%$ from 192 to 173.
- Within the non-resident category, enrollment of students from another country (with or without an educational visa) decreased $6 \%$ from 7,318 to 6,881 while FTES decreased $5 \%$ from 759 to 718 .

International Students

- International students with F1 or FZ visa status headcount is at 1,976, down from 2,064 last spring, a -4\% decrease.
- Females comprise $47 \%$ of the international students with F1 or FZ visa status.
- Top countries of origin for F1 or FZ international students includes: China, Vietnam, South Korea, Taiwan, and Japan.

Student Type

- First-time student headcount increased $21 \%$ from 316 to 382 and FTES increased $36 \%$ from 74 to 101 .
- First-time transfer student headcount increased $3 \%$ from 1,132 to 1,164 while FTES decreased 1\% from 197 to 196.
- Continuing student headcount decreased $6 \%$ from 15,322 to 14,356 and FTES decreased $7 \%$ from 4,387 to 4,100 .
- Returning student headcount increased 2\% from 1,984 to 2,029 and FTES increased 2\% from 355 to 361.
- Special admit high school student headcount increased $24 \%$ from 217 to 270 while FTES increased $7 \%$ from 46 to 49 . This student group has seen consistent growth each quarter for the past year.
