I. COURSE DESCRIPTION:

ESL 234 is an intensive language class intended to improve your listening, speaking, reading, writing and grammar skills in English so that you can be more successful in your school, work, and personal life. We will work on building vocabulary, improving grammar knowledge, listening and reading comprehension, increasing speaking ability, and focus on writing correct grammatical sentences and short paragraphs in English. ESL 234 is a ten-unit class, so you may expect up to 20 hours of homework. Be sure to have plenty of time in your schedule to keep up with the assignments. Even if you are taking 434 (not for credit), the course expectations are identical.

To take this class, you must have received a qualifying score on the ESL placement test.
